

Nurse's Notes from Mrs. Geiselhardt, School Nurse



What a winter so far for illnesses and absences! The level of influenza A is high and Covid-19 is medium. We are seeing cases of both, and several other viruses are going around school.

Here are some tips on boosting your child's immune system:

- ✓ Give them a healthy diet. Lots of fruits and veggies , whole grains, lean protein, and healthy fats.
- ✓ Make sure they get enough sleep. Here's what is recommended for each age group: 3-5 years: 10-13 hours (including naps) 6-12 years: 9-12 hours 13-18 years: 8-10 hours
- ✓ Also, try to stop screen time 2 hours before bedtime and don't have any devices in the bedroom.
- ✓ Get them active. An hour a day is optimal. They can play a sport or play in the park, go to the gym or go for a walk.
- ✓ Manage stress. Kids need downtime to play and do things that make them happy. Let them talk and listen to them! (The car is a good place.) If you think your child is depressed or anxious, seek help from a mental health professional.
- ✓ Make sure they are up to date on important vaccines.
 PreK flu shots were due on 12/31/2022. It's not too late for anyone to get a Flu shot.
- ✓ Don't forget simple precautions: hand washing, respiratory etiquette (cover coughs and sneezes, discard tissues, wash hands or use hand sanitizer), stay away from sick people, consider a mask in crowded indoor spaces, and stay home when sick. Any new symptoms warrant keeping your child home for observation and they definitely should not be in school with a temperature equal to or over 100.4, vomiting, diarrhea, pink eye, or a rash of unknown origin.

CALLING IN ABSENCES

Since the pandemic started there are more reporting requirements for school nurses on "influenza-like" illnesses including Covid-19, influenza, and RSV. If your child is going to be absent and tests positive for anything, please let me know in an email or by phone as soon as you can. When calling in your student's illness, it's really helpful to clearly state the name, grade or teacher, symptoms, what they tested positive for, and the date tested (if you already saw a health provider). Clothing Collection

I am collecting gently used clothing, especially pants, of all sizes to have in the health office in case of accidents, If I have clothing that fits, I will not have to call the parent to bring in a clean set of clothes for a child. I also need donations of new boys and girls underwear especially in small sizes for PK-1st graders. If your child borrows clothing from the nurse, please wash and return it.

Screenings

I will begin mandatory state screenings of the students for height, weight, blood pressure (all students), vision, hearing (every year for PK-3, then every other year), and scoliosis (5th and 7th graders). If you have questions, please email me at mgeiselhart@rochellepark.org.
